

In rural America... Over-the-air TV may disappear forever !

Soon the FCC will take away TV channels used by many rural TV translator stations and small TV stations and auction them off.

The buyers will be the Smartphone companies.... and in the process, the small TV broadcasters and translators will lose their channels, be forced to move or worse, go off the air and will not receive a dime from the sale. Their viewers will lose their TV programming and numerous small station enterprises may be destroyed.

The result? **No** local programming, **no** free TV programs, **no** news, **no** ETV, **nothing** for millions of rural, elderly, or low-income folks who have relied on free over the air TV for over 40 years.

Here's what you can do...

How to help save free rural TV before they sell off all its TV channels...

1. When any TV channel rendered useless for a translator or LPTV station, the FCC should work with other federal entities such as the Department of Commerce grand program to establish a fund (such as it did for the DTV transition) to make whole the affected translators, LPTV stations and their viewers.
2. Ask the FCC to revise its interference standards to allow LPTV stations and translators to change channels or move more easily.
